2024: Year In Review

This past year was filled with new and exciting developments at the Building for Kids, deepening our support for kids and grown-ups. In addition to updated and enhanced immersive play-based learning environments, we expanded our programming in response to community needs and created treasured memories through one-of-a-kind events. Here are just a few highlights from this past year

New and Renovated Exhibits

"The Story of the Land Where We Stand" is a new, interactive art installation featuring a colorful mural by Menominee artist Renny Katchenago and created in partnership with the College of Menominee Nation, Kaehkenawapahtaeq Charter School, and the Menominee Language & Culture Commission

We celebrated ribbon cuttings for *The Lab* sponsored by Amcor, *The* Studio sponsored by School Specialty, the Littlest Branch sponsored by Fox Community Credit Union, and the Doll Hospital sponsored by ThedaCare.

Lastly, our new outer space-themed Welcome Center creates a safer and more efficient experience for visitors and includes a gift shop with exciting BFK merchandise and high-quality educational items to continue the play-based learning at home.

BFK Impact Crew

The BFK Impact Crew was designed to inspire the next generation of change makers! Through facilitated programs and opportunities to create their own fundraising pages to support the BFK, Impact Crew members learned how they can use their voice to make a difference in our community.

Early Childhood Continuum

To provide more opportunities for families with young children to connect, learn, and grow, we expanded our specially-designed, facilitated age cohort programming for 0-4 year olds with our Welcome Baby, Early Explorers, and Jr. Explorers programs.

32 years ago, I visited the museum for the first time as a child. That visit was filled with excitement, discovery, and some of the most vivid memories I have as a young child. While I got to spend significantly more time at the museum this past year at 36 than I did at 4, I am amazed at how this special place continues to embody those same feelings for me and nearly 130,000 kids and their grown-ups each year.

Our members, donors, visitors, volunteers, team members, and partners should be incredibly proud of what we accomplished over the last year and the foundation we've continued to strengthen for the future of our community.

From new exhibit spaces and security enhancements to a dramatic expansion in programming addressing the emerging needs of kids and their grown-ups, there is far too much to celebrate from 2024 to fit within a single newsletter.
