A Strong Foundation

Investing in early childhood is one of the most powerful ways to shape a thriving community. By supporting children in their earliest years, the Building for Kids aims to create a strong foundation of impact that benefits families, schools, and the broader community for generations to come.

At the heart of this foundation is our Early Childhood Continuum, a series of free programs that harnesses the power of intergenerational, play-based learning to support, empower, and connect caregivers and their young children. The Continuum begins with the **Welcome Baby Community** for first-time parents and infants, transitions into **Early Explorers** for toddlers and their caregivers, and culminates in **Jr. Explorers**—a drop-off program for kids ages 3 and 4.

These programs not only strengthen families but also address urgent challenges in our community. The pandemic disrupted early learning opportunities, leaving many children without critical social experiences. The Continuum helps close these gaps by creating environments where children learn to grow confidence, interact with peers, and adapt to new settings.

“When kids enter programs like [Jr. Explorers], you see a wide variety of things start to happen,” said Carla Jones, Speech Language Pathologist at the Appleton Area School District. “They really blossom in their social-emotional competencies, they become more independent, and they become more comfortable being away from their parents for the first time.”



In addition to helping children develop critical skills, the Early Childhood Continuum also connects families to resources—and each other. Breanna Mekuly, City of Appleton Community Health Supervisor, has noted trends from the Community Health Needs Assessment of reduced access to basic needs and increasing feelings of loneliness and isolation among families. Our programs help address these challenges by offering free childcare opportunities, linking parents to community resources, and creating spaces where families in similar life stages can connect. Many participants leave with new friendships and greater confidence in accessing the support available throughout the community.

Since its launch in 2020, our Early Childhood Continuum has impacted over 11,000 participants, and we're excited to keep expanding these opportunities and reach more people every year.

Family Spotlight: The Skowanderson Family

One family who has experienced the impact of our Early Childhood Continuum firsthand is the Skowandersons.

The Skowandersons were first introduced to Jr. Explorers in 2024, when they were looking for something to challenge their now 5-year-old daughter. Seeing how much their daughter loved the program, they enrolled their son in our current session of Jr. Explorers.

Kristina Skowanderson explained that her son was initially anxious about separating from a parent, so she was worried about how he would adjust to making friends and being more independent.

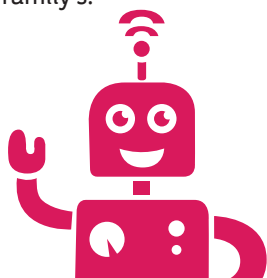
However, since starting the program, she has watched him confidently build friendships, explore on his own, and grow in a new environment.

"We had a few tears on our first days, but so far, my son has thrived," said Kristina. "He's now excited to go and wakes up in the morning and asks when he gets to go to Jr. Explorers."

For Kristina, Jr. Explorers has not only offered learning opportunities for her kids, but also a sense of community. The program has allowed her family to connect with others in similar stages of life and build relationships that extend beyond the museum.

"I believe it's one of the best programs our community has to offer," Kristina said. "I can't wait to have my youngest daughter join when she turns three because I know she will love it."

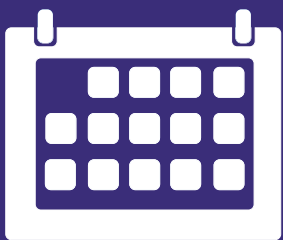
